EDUCATOR'S TOP ACTIVITIES

Here are our **favorite lesson plans and activities** teachers are using after reading *My Neighborhood* with their class. Some activities may require more planning than others so we've categorized them from 1-4 stars based on level of planning/preparation.



Game Play

Physical Education
Talk with students about games everyone can play. Then play those games or play hopscotch like in the book.

Spelling Pattern

Spelling/Language
Tell the children that
thinking about what a
word looks like is a
useful spelling strategy,
so you are going to
explore some common
spelling patterns
together. Ex. Look for
and list words with or in
the book: pastor, store,
doctor, report,
neighborhood

People and Places

Identify the people (pilot) and places (nail salon) in the book.
Discuss what happens in those places around the neighborhood.



Acrostic Poem

Writing/Language
Students write an acrostic
poem using the word
"Neighborhood"

Journal Writing

- "Where is your favorite place in the neighborhood?"
- "Draw your favorite part of the book. Write a sentence about it."

Neighborhood Art

Art

Draw a picture of your favorite place in your neighborhood.

Draw a map of your neighborhood.



Neighborhood Walk

Art/Writing
Supplies needed:
Camera (phone, tablet, digital)

Take a neighborhood walk and ask students to take pictures of their favorite places. Then, print pictures and have students write descriptive words/sentences about what they saw.

Junior Reporters

Language, Oratory
Have students find
positive news stories in
the neighborhood; come
back and share with the
class (ex. Someone gets
a puppy or someone has
a birthday party, etc.)



Neighborhood Brochure

Art/Writing
Have students pick a place
in their neighborhood,
take pictures and create a
brochure/advertisement.

OR

Students create a book about a favorite place in their neighborhood. Tell a story about the place.

Take a Tour/Field Trip

Contact local community landmarks or businesses with huge community impact in the area to take students on a tour. Ex. Grocery store, Fire Station, Book Store, etc.
